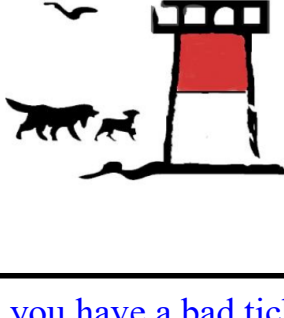
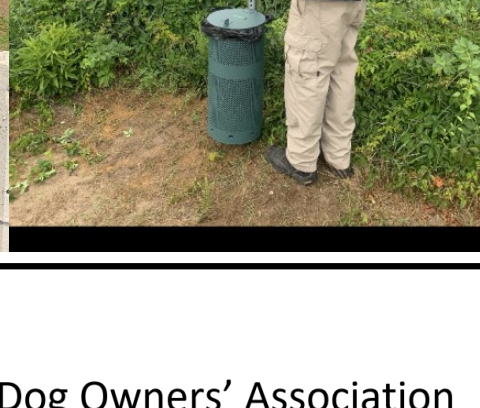
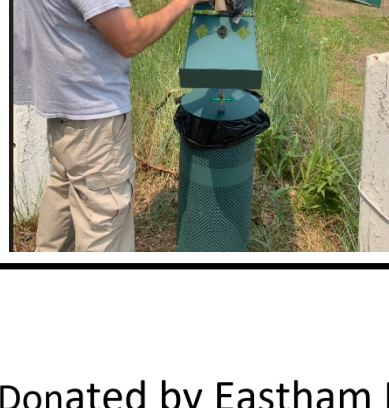
New bag supply stations installed

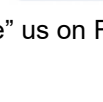
Do you have a bad tick?

You may know that service that accepts ticks from the public and test them for disease. Well, results are in and the news seems good. If you love charts and graphs you are going to love this website. <https://www.tickreport.com/stats> The website has incidence of each disease like Lyme and anaplasmosis and sorts by Zip code, host affected, species of vector (tick) and even what part of the body was bitten.

Bottom line is that there was a very low incidence in this area, but we are not out of the woods yet.
