

Most Dangerous Threat to Dogs is Coming

No, not coyotes, bears or even people. It's almost tick season. The CDC reports a 70% increase in diseased tick bites. The increase is not so much the number of ticks, but reflects better reporting protocols.

Diseases carried by the appalling arachnids are more widespread than ever. Local experts say you can assume that all ticks on Cape Cod are carriers of viruses and bacteria that can sicken or even kill dogs and people. [\(More on this is future newsletters\)](#)
